Directions: Take PA Turnpike East to exit 110 (Somerset/Johnstown). Follow PA 31 East to Route 219 South. Take 219 South to US 40. Take US 40 East to Cumberland, MD. Get off onto MD route 51/Industrial Blvd (Exit 43B) towards airport. Follow 51S for 13.4 miles. Turn left onto E. Wilson Rd. After 0.6 miles turn left onto Scout Camp Rd.

At 7PM, there will be an informational meeting in the campsite. If you find that you're running late, be sure to contact Craig Spink at (412) 999-0854. Craig will be the point of contact for Conclave.

Brothers,

It is with deep sadness that I inform you that Deac Smith passed away recently. Deac earned his Eagle Scout rank in 1935. He served our country in the U.S. Army and served our youth as Boy Scout leader for seven decades. He did Vesper services at many OA and Council events. He was a Vigil Honor member of our Lodge and was an outstanding example of what Vigil Honor exemplifies. He was always available at a moment's notice to run a Vespers service or do anything else he was asked to do. He would drop everything to help out on an Eagle Scout Board.

Deac was an outstanding example of all the values Scouting tries to teach. Deac had many great services that he presented at Vesper services over the years. One service that always comes to mind when I think of Deac is the footprints on the pavement service. Deac started by describing his observations of people walking through a puddle on a city street. People with different shoes would leave a trail of

footprints of different lengths down the street depending on the type of shoe they wore. His analogy was comparing how far wet footprints would last on a city sidewalk to the effect you have on your surroundings based on your behavior and character. The greater influence you have on helping people, especially our youth, to develop to be better people, the longer your footprints will last on the pavement. If we can leave a trail of footprints on the pavement half as long as Deac's we will have done well!

Goodbye, Deac, we will miss you but we won't forget what you tried to teach us.
